Director's Comment

Al Gore was in London last month giving his talk on climate change, why its happening and what needs to be done to stem the growing flood of bad news from the rapidly melting Arctic and Antarctica. It was an impressive presentation, with fantastic images, graphs, charts and high-tech tools carrying a powerful set of messages. And Gore has learnt how to be funny, ironic, able to laugh at himself and others, bringing a lightness of touch and vigour to the debate which visibly energises his audience. His focus is tightly trained on the US voter. His pitch is to convince the US public of the need for change, so that their children and grandchildren will have a future worth living, by cutting back on carbon emissions and investing in new technology. It's an appeal to their interests and affections, and there's a profit to be made from it too. New investment, carbon trading, biofuels, innovative engines... you can have your cake and eat it too. But there is a blind spot when it comes to thinking about the rest of the world. We must also find ways of helping poor countries and communities adapt to the challenges of today and tomorrow - that's our agenda for the next decade.
