- TIME
- INFRASTRUCTURE
- CAPACITY OF STAKEHOLDERS
- LANGUAGE
- SIZE OF REGION
- PERCEPTION OF THE PROCESS AS  
ALIGNED WITH INDUSTRY

# POSSIBLE PRIORITISATION CRITERIA

- IMPLEMENTABLE (eg COSTS & CAPACITY
- REGIONAL RELEVANCE
- IMPACT – MAKES THE BIGGEST CHANGE (1 YR AND 5 YRS)
- TRANSFERABLE OVER THE SD SPECTRUM
- PROMOTES MULTISTAKEHOLDER PARTNERSHIPS.
