Cameroon 2012 work plan will focus on the following four thematic areas:

- 1. Very Small Forest Enterprises (VSFEs)
- 2. Legitimate Forest Products (LFPs)
- 3. Climate Change (CC), REDD and Livelihoods
- 4. Transactional exchanges

Activities:

Major activities will include the following:

- 1. Policy influence:
 - a. Policy brief on governance and green business lessons from Cameroon
 - b. Advocate with government officials
- 2. VSFEs:
 - a. I-learn seminar on natural-based innovations and enterprise development in Cameroon
 - b. Participatory assessment of key natural resources streams for VSFEs
 - c. Work with African Model Forest Network (AMFN) to document key advances and issues on governance and business model and local sustainable (green) development
- 3. LFPs:
 - a. Lobby to improve the market regulatory environment for Non Timber Forest Products-based small businesses
 - b. Studies and publications on biodiversity conservation, Human Wildlife Conflicts and LFPs
- 4. CC:
 - a. Assess and document REDD+ relevance and opportunities in relation to local livelihoods and carbon-smart local businesses
- 5. Transnational exchanges:
 - a. Africa-Asia networking on key common issues
 - b. Work with IIED to prepare Learning Event 2013
